Event Information

VELOTHON Wales offers cycling enthusiasts the unique opportunity to ride through the stunning scenery of South Wales. There are 3 routes available with 140KM, 125KM and 60KM distances.

Road Closures

On Sunday 8th July 2018, there will be several road closures in the south Wales area. Therefore, please take a look at our road closure information so you can plan your routes in advance of the event.

Cyclists begin the event at King Edward VII Avenue, Cardiff at 7am and the last cyclist expected to return at approximately 4.30pm.

Local Traffic Management

Residents of Lisvane will be able to get from Everest Avenue onto Mill Road and vice versa for the duration of the road closures, using a traffic light system.

Residents of Queen Anne Square will be able to access their property all day, with the use of a filter lane from Colum Road onto Corbett Road. You will then be able to exit onto North Road.

There will be a filter lane in place from Thornhill Road to New House Country Hotel for anyone wishing to access the hotel on the day.

Rhydypenau Primary School will be open for access between Fidas Avenue and Rhydypenau Road.

Parking on the route

If you park your car directly on the route, please be aware you may be required to move your car prior to the event. This is also the case for areas used for feed stations.

Keep an eye out for traffic enforcement notices which will go out 2 weeks before the event. There is a risk your car will be towed if you do not comply with these notices.

Public Transport

There may be a change to your normal service on the event day due to road closures. If you need to know more information on if your journey is affected, please refer to the transport providers website, where changes are normally listed.

Emergency Services

All emergency services will be operating as normal and have full access to the closed roads in case of emergencies.

All emergency services are liaised with prior to the event, attending all planning meetings. In addition, a representative from each emergency service will be present in our event control room, ensuring a smooth running of services.

If you require an emergency service, please ring 999 as normal.

Expectant Mothers

If you are an expectant mother and are concerned about reaching hospital on the day of the event, please do get in touch with us before the event and we'll be able to assist you.

Carers

We work closely with the local authorities to get in touch with all care agencies that may be affected on the route. If you're a carer, please do check with your manager to see if we have already issued passes to your agency. If not, please do get in touch with us on velothonwales@ironmanroadaccess.com so we can issue you a road pass.

On Call Doctors, Emergency Vets and District Nurses

If you are an on call doctor, emergency vet or district nurse that may be affected by the road closures, please do get in touch with us on velothonwales@ironmanroadaccess.com and we will be able to assist you.

Pedestrians

Pedestrians are allowed to walk along the route during the road closures. We advise pedestrians are sensible and take care when crossing the road, as you would if the road was open.
